Cautious Coal

Coal the cat was brought to the shelter in July 2023. Sadly, his owner had passed away, and while he and his owner were strongly bonded, Coal did not tolerate the company of other humans. Now that his person was gone, he couldn't be handled by the family and it was decided his best chance for a happy life would be through BHS.

Like other "Spicy" cats, he was placed in a kennel and given time to acclimate before our staff began the process of his formal medical intake. However, he was so spicy that days turned into weeks turned into months, with staff faithfully and carefully cleaning his kennel, feeding and watering him, and offering treats. He was under enough stress that he contracted an upper respiratory infection shortly after arriving. We did the best we could to medicate him, but he still wouldn't allow a full exam.

In early November, we finally won enough of his trust to fully examine him and catch him up to date on all treatments. On April 8th, a full nine months after his surrender, he was adopted. YOUR faithful support is what makes stories like Coal's possible. Thank you!

You may remember Harlow from last summer's newsletter. One of our beloved long-stay dogs, she was timid with a bark that warned people of her stranger danger. Despite being an affectionate and loyal dog, this made it difficult for her to connect with prospective adopters. But once she rewarded you with her trust, she quickly found her way into your heart. After being here for just under a year and winning the hearts of everyone on staff, she finally found her perfect match! Congratulations, Harlow!

Dixie arrived as a stray in August 2023, a beautiful female Rottweiler we aged at around 4 years old. We were certain that someone would arrive shortly to claim this beautiful and friendly girl, but to our surprise, no one ever did.

After she'd been with us for a few days, we began to notice that she had some discharge, a symptom common for pyometra, which is an infection of the uterus, a potentially dangerous condition. She was immediately scheduled for a spay surgery and we anticipated the discharge would stop. Unfortunately, it didn't, and we soon realized she was leaking urine. In the meantime, she also contracted a round of kennel cough and a nasty gastrointestinal illness, along with exhibiting some stress-related symptoms and discomfort. It seemed like Dixie couldn't catch a break, but this otherwise healthy and congenial girl was worth the investigation.

After months of speculating on one condition or another, one of our Veterinary Technicians, Stacey, asked whether it could potentially be an ectopic ureter, which is when one or more of the tubes from the kidney to the bladder bypass



the bladder entirely and urine exits the body directly. Eureka! This was it!

Dixie had surgery in March 2024 to correct the misplaced ureter. Though it will still take some time before we know if the problem is 100% solved, and she may need incontinence medications for the rest of her life, we've already seen a wonderful improvement and anticipate Dixie will soon be ready to find her new home.



Moto Moto is a stray cat who came to us a few weeks ago in pretty rough shape. He may have been attacked by another animal or hit by a vehicle. We can't know for sure, but we've patched him up and he's currently isolating and getting lots of rest. Stories like this are why we're here, and your support is why we're able to help Moto Moto and other animals like him. Thank you.

RECURRING DONORS ARE GOOD NEWS


