Dear Friends,

Another year of hard work and big love draws to a close at Bangor Humane Society. Though the challenges of the changing landscape of animal welfare have kept us on our toes,it's been a year full of success. With your help, we've

found new homes for 1,744 pets, and celebrated BIG when some of our long-stay canine friends finally found their forever families. We've reunited 280 pets with rightful owners. And thanks to your generosity, 2,080 animals found respite at BHS.

We completed work on a huge HVAC upgrade that simply couldn't wait any longer. Our heating and cooling systems can now keep pace with our modern facility. Our animals (and our people!) will be warm in the winter and cool in the summer. Temperature control keeps everyone comfortable, making recovery times for the injured or ill that much faster. Thank you for caring so much that repairs like this are possible.

We have worked hard to improve our medical efficiencies, successfully transitioning all but the most complicated or emergent cases to our in-house staff and dedicated, on-site contracting veterinary partners. As costs for everything from food to medical supplies continue to rise, we thank you for making that care possible.

Your support means animals can continue to be housed and served for as long as it takes for them to find a home. The time you take to visit, share social media posts, tell friends about the work of saving animal lives, volunteer, foster, or collect and donate supplies is what keeps us going. The world feels a little like a roller coaster some days, but I am grateful our combined dedication to animals can help keep us grounded.

If the best way to improve your life is to be in service to others, then we hope your lives and hearts feel as full as ours.



FROM THE PRESIDENT

You make me feel unbelievably lucky to serve on the BHS Board of Directors. As I complete my seventh year in service to the board, and my second year as President, I am at a loss to accurately describe just how lucky we ALL are to be part of this team. We often hear words like "team" and "teamwork" without experiencing the true meaning of them, and it has been a great privilege being part of this team with YOU every day. It's been the most uplifting period of my life. As this year draws to a close, I reflect on the many accomplishments our team has celebrated, one of which was a huge improvement project

that could not have been completed without your help.

At the beginning of the year, it was apparent that our old heating and cooling systems had reached the end of their service life. The constant repairs were both cost-prohibitive and inefficient, and a unanimous vote from the board approved the purchase of new systems, both of which were necessary to maintain top level animal care and comfort. Staff members were an integral part of planning, and while there were many inconveniences, they seamlessly adapted their workflow to accommodate the scope of this project. The replacements are finally complete, and our building and animals are warm. Your generosity helped make this a success! Teamwork!!

It takes a big team to run an animal shelter. Our generous community of donors, business partners, and grantors provide the financial support the shelter needs to keep operating; I have personally witnessed many wonderful people dropping off towels, blankets, food, and anything animal related; and the turnout and support for this year's Paws on Parade was spectacular. Your cheerleading never fails to inspire us. You are all a valuable part of our team and thank you just doesn't seem to be enough. Please know you are appreciated—thank you all!


RESOURCES FOR PETS AND FAMILIES

At BHS, we are deeply committed to supporting pet owners and the communities we proudly serve. We understand the challenges that many families face, and we remain dedicated to providing resources and assistance wherever possible.

Our mission centers on the humane treatment and adoption of companion animals, while also prioritizing efforts to keep pets with their current families whenever feasible. In line with this commitment, we have provided access to low-income spay/neuter vouchers, marking 15 years of aiding pet owners in affording sterilization procedures and helping to prevent overpopulation. For the second year in a row, we have partnered with Maine Woods Mobile Vet to offer an on-site low-cost spay/neuter clinic for cats. Our Spay-Your-Mama program provides temporary shelter for pregnant or nursing mama cats and dogs, allowing them to care for their young and be sterilized before being returned to their owners. Lastly, we continue to provide essential pet food and supplies to families in need across our region, ensuring that pets remain healthy, well-fed, and supported.

We currently serve more than 34 cities, towns, and unorganized territories and our dedication to both animals and the people in our community remains unwavering. With your help, we are grateful for the opportunity to make a positive impact.


Intakes by the Numbers




